



Canadian Statistics

- ▶ 14-19% of BC youth identify as LGBTQ
 - ► (14% South Vanc Island)
 - ► (7% have no attraction South Vanc Island)
- 21% of LGBTQ students reported being physically harassed or assaulted because of their sexual orientation
- ▶ 64% of LGBTQ youth report feeling unsafe at school
- Verbal Harassment of Youth:
 - ▶ 70% Trans-Students
 - ► 40-50% LGBT Students and those with
 - same-sex parents
 - ▶ 20% Non-LGBT Students



Canadian Statistics

- 68% of lesbian/gay youth who reported a lack of adult support at school never or almost never felt safe at school
- Parent attitudes matter. Parental rejection of gay teens can adversely affect their health:
 - 8 x more likely to have attempted suicide than those whose families accepted them
 - ▶ 6 x as likely to report depression
 - 3 x as likely to use drugs
 - > 3 x as likely to have unprotected sex
- Rejected gay teens are also disproportionately represented among the homeless, in foster care and in juvenile detention.



Canadian Statistics

- 2/3 of trans youth have reported self-harm
- ▶ 1/3 of trans youth have attempted suicide
- Students in schools with GSAs are more likely to:
 - see their schools as supportive of LGBTQ people
 - be open with some / all of their peers about their SOGI
 - see their school as less homophobic
